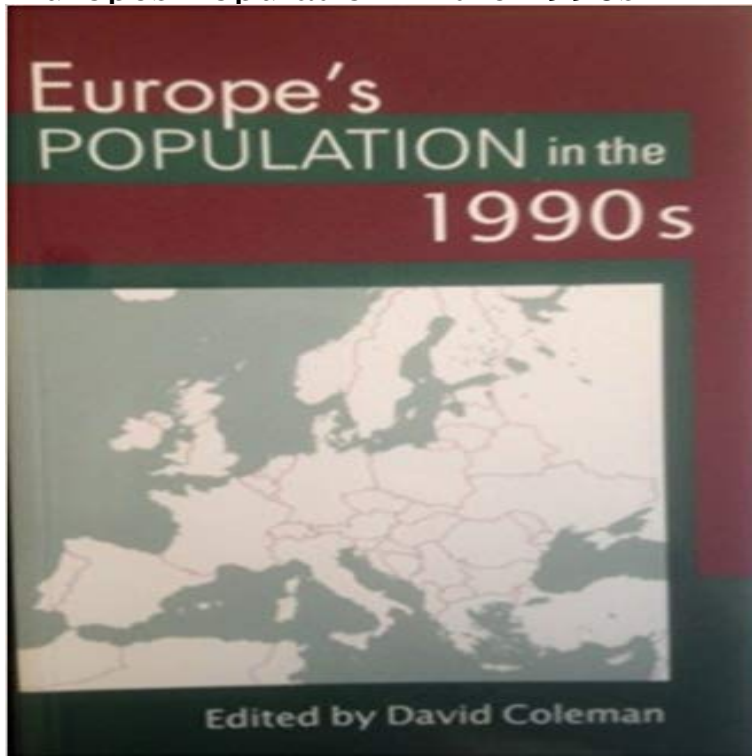


## Europe's Population in the 1990s
